COM1215 – Photography – Exposure Outline

Now that you understand what makes a good photo, the following Photography modules will each begin to focus in on one particular aspect of photography. In this case, we will focus on Exposure.

Level: Introductory

Prerequisite: COM1005: Visual Composition

Description: Students learn the technical and creative uses of aperture, shutter speed and ISO, and demonstrate how combinations of the three elements give very different results. Students also discover how a correct exposure is obtained through the combination of shutter speed, aperture and ISO, which make up the photographic triangle.

Parameters: Access to a camera with the ability to control aperture and shutter speed independently, and to processing and display equipment.

Course Structure

COM1215 – Photography is arranged into 3 sections: Introductory assignments, projects, and a portfolio. The Introductory assignment will allow you to familiarize yourself with basic camera functions and features. Each of the 6 project will focus on taking photos that fit a certain theme. The best images that you take for your assignments will be used to create a portfolio of your work. These should be your best photos that you have taken throughout the module.
